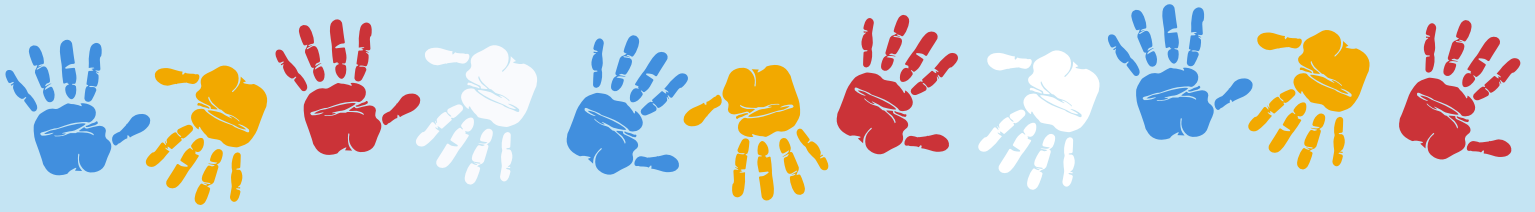
What is Our Mission?

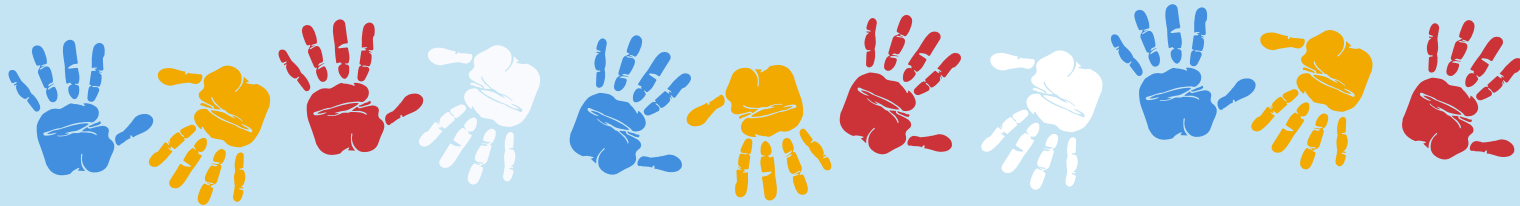

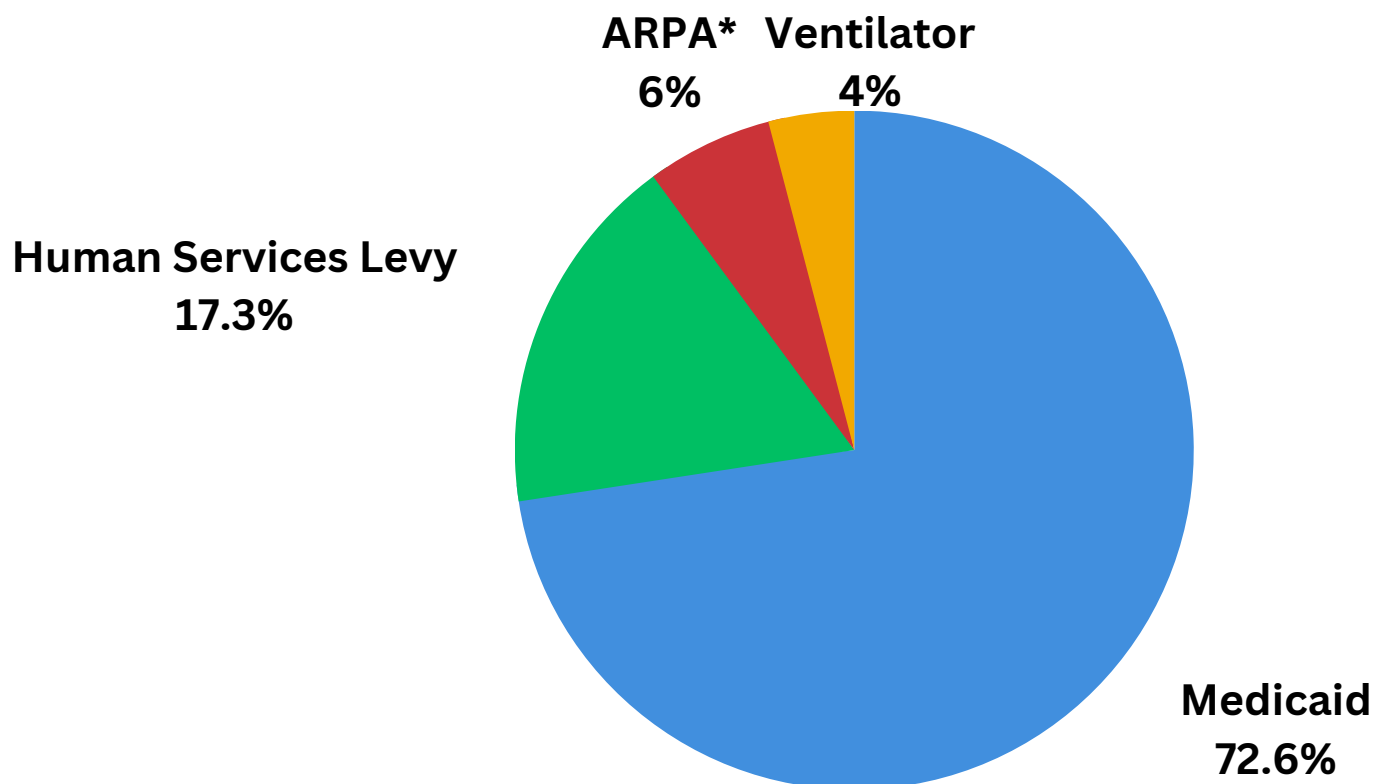

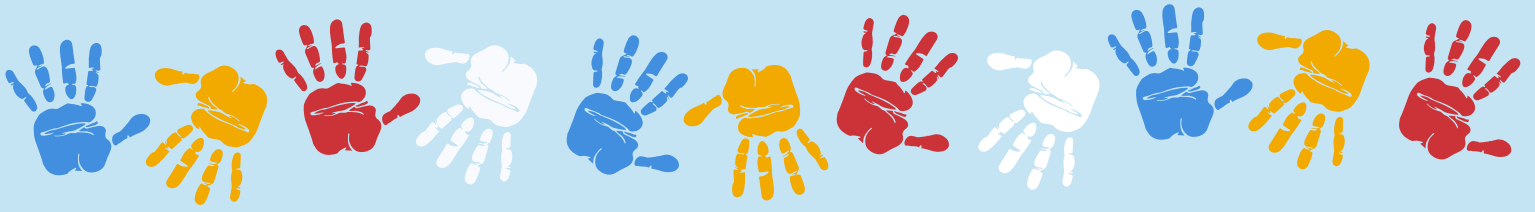

Surur's Story

It's an incredible story of survival - Surur Ali was left permanently disabled after traffickers took his kidney while his family was trying to flee Eritrea in Africa.

Their journey to freedom would take nearly 10 years and lead them more than 7,000 miles away - to Montgomery County's Stillwater Center. Now, Surur is thriving.

"He has been through a lot, and he suffered a lot. He's getting better and we have high hopes for him," said Mohammad Nur, Surur's father.

Staff at Stillwater Center were taught basic greetings in his native language to help Surur and his family feel welcome.

Surur is allowed to ride his trike throughout the facility. Staff also make sure he can go anywhere a teen might want to go in his wheelchair - from school every day to events like Hauntfest at Kings Island.

Surur is now safe and never has to worry about being harmed ever again.

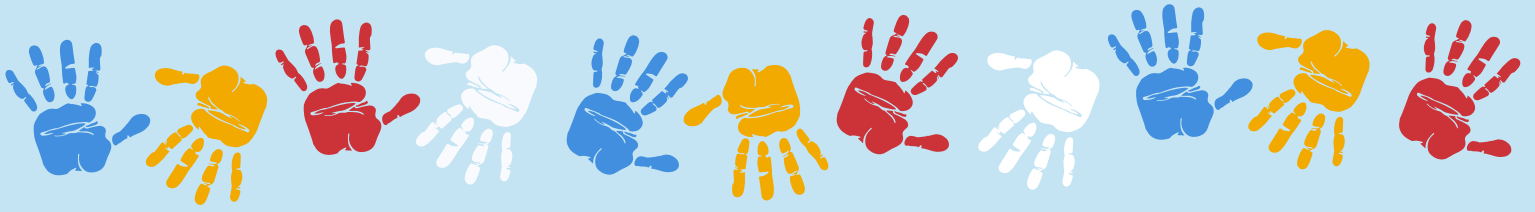
A Head Above the Rest

On the morning of the 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes, after losing everything, one employee called off while she was in a shelter. That is the only time she has called off.

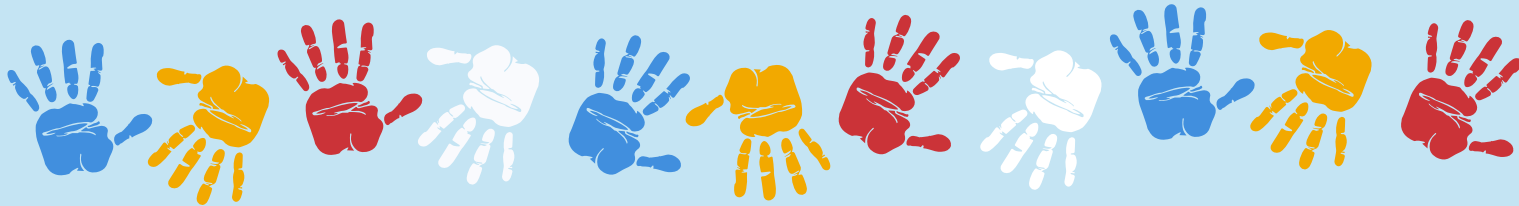
One employee walks three miles each day to catch his bus for work. He does so rain or shine.
